








## CONNECTIONS **Eunice Slagle Gallery** New Object Pairings

Connections pairs together seemingly unrelated objects that speak to each other in surprising ways. A September exhibit update introduced over twenty new artifacts including a large reed organ, a jar of popcorn, a soap box derby helmet, a scale model of a dairy barn, and more. What's the connection? Come and see.

**Right** • These two black-and-white sketches were created by Edna Agar (left) and John H. "Texas Jack" Sullivan Jr. (right) who grew up in Valparaiso at the turn of the 20th century. Though they pursued very different careers, each was a successful entertainer, taught their craft across the country, and dipped their toes in the movie industry. When paired together, these two cartoon drawings create a comical, if somewhat menacing, narrative.

## LOWENSTINE WWII ROLL **OF HONOR**

The Lowenstine WWII Roll of Honor commemorates Valparaiso citizens who contributed to the war effort during World War II. Originally displayed on the courthouse square between 1943 and 1973, it was installed in the PoCo Muse in December 2022.

## **ART STORAGE PROJECT**

This spring, the lota Chapter of Tri Kappa awarded a \$1,100 grant to the PoCo Muse to make improvements in our art storage facilities. The project was completed this summer. As a result, the museum has a much-enhanced capability to provide safe storage for its collection and has extra capacity for new acquisitions.

The grant funds allowed us to repurpose functional shelving and gridwalls to accommodate framed artwork. Powder-coated gridwalls were mounted to the walls (left) which allowed for flexible and visible storage of artwork. Plywood shelves were treated to prevent "off-gassing," which over time can harm artifacts. They were then lined with ethafoam padding and divided with rope to allow for stable "cubby" storage (right). The artwork is stacked upright and safely separated with acid-free foam


