



# Dunes Paintings from the Brockington Collection

Two works from notable artists in the Philipp Brockington Collection will be featured in the upcoming exhibit, *The Drama of the Dunes*, opening May 25 in the Robert Cain Gallery.

Regarded as the "artist laureate" of the Indiana lakefront, David Sander (left) was a well-known artist, musician, author, printmaker, and founding member of the Chesterton Art Center.

James S. Wilson III (right) of Gary's Miller Beach was an executive at Inland Steel for thirty years before becoming an accomplished watercolor artist of scenes from his beloved Northwest Indiana.

### **Your Contributions Help Conserve our Collection**

Eighteen works of pictorial marguetry created by resident Paul Halfdan Magnor (1893-1984) were given to the PoCo Muse by Pearl Wheeler Magnor in 1985. Marguetry involves the intricate assembly of thin layers of wood veneer into a decorative pattern or representational picture.

The works were carefully inspected by experts in preparation for the upcoming Against the Grain exhibition, and it was found that the original color of the underlying wood veneer had faded due to exposure to ultra-violet light.

With the help of contributions like yours, the PoCo Muse is able to explore the conservation and restoration of the works of art entrusted to our care.
